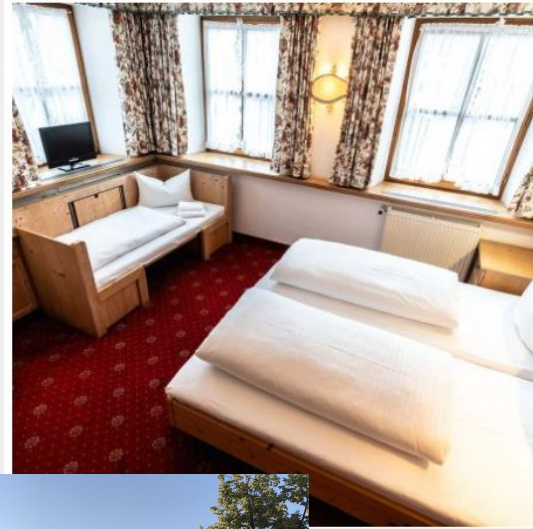

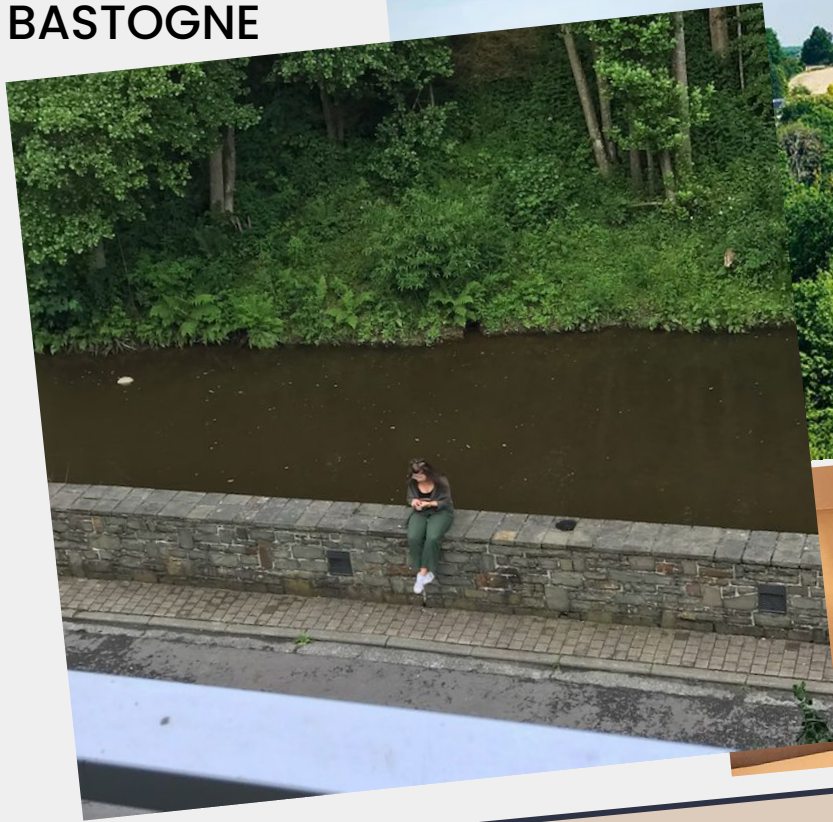

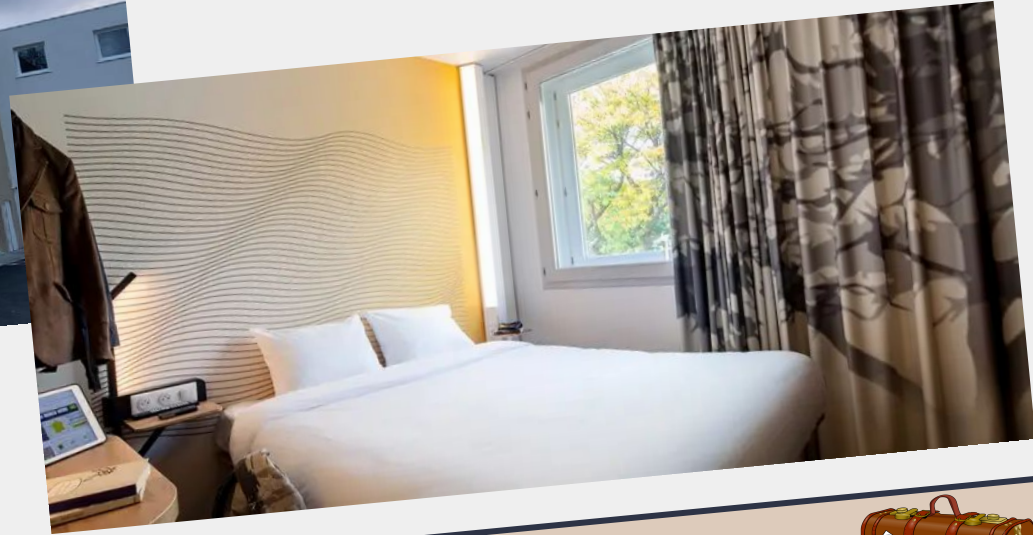

- Pack light
 - You'll be responsible for carrying your own luggage
 - Leave room for souvenirs
- Bring items you can mix-and-match
 - Create outfits before the trip
 - Pack outfits in 1 gallon or 2 gallon size ziploc bags.
 - Roll your clothes and use packing cubes
 - Bring shoes that'll work with everything - *Although comfort should always take priority over style*
 - Limit shoes to NO MORE than 2 pairs (including the ones you're wearing)
 - Bring a big Ziploc bag in case shoes get dirty to avoid contaminating the rest of your clothing.



- Wear heavy or bulky items – something that doubles as a rain jacket
 - You'll likely want that jacket on the plane or in the airport, anyway
- DON'T pack anything “just in case”
 - The temps are likely to be from 60's to high 70's – Don't worry about a *bunch* of bulky, warm clothing
- Ditch the bulky toiletry bag – gonna have to put stuff in clear baggie, anyway, so you might as well just use that
 - Make sure to bring travel-sized toiletries 3.1 oz/100 ml or less
 - Anything non-gel or non liquid is a good idea, example: shampoo bars
 - Makeup: up to you, but you'll get tired of worrying about it after the third day. Plus, y'know, security
 - There will be plenty of places to buy any of toiletries over there



- Only bring prescription meds – GLs will have over-the-counter stuff, and there'll be pharmacies everywhere we go.
 - Be aware, if you want to bring along that travel pillow, that you'll have to lug it along
 - There are inflatable options, and/or ones that will clip to your bag.
- Please don't bring stuffed animals, if you leave your Wubbie in Belgium, he's staying there
- Leave your laptop at home – This is good security advice, as well.
- Swimming suits are up to you. There may be a swimming pool at one or two of the hotels, but we may not have a bunch of time to swim, and/or will you even have the energy?
- Most hotels will have hair dryers. We'll be leaving so early, each morning, that you'll likely only have time to “show and go”, so leave them home
 - Same goes with hair irons.



- Situational awareness is vitally important
 - DON'T walk around with your face in your phone (You're in Europe! LOOK! IT'S A CASTLE!!!)
 - Pay attention to who is watching you and your colleagues
 - There may be rascallions about, preying on obvious tourists. Don't engage with a "friendly" stranger who tries to start a conversation out of nowhere.
 - Don't worry about being rude. Ne'er-do-wells count on people not wanting to offend
 - They sometimes will use children to play on your sympathy
- Big fan of slash proof passport holders, fanny pack etc.

 - Also a big fan of the brand Travelon



- Empty your wallet of all your loyalty cards – If fact, just leave your wallet at home
 - only bring whatever debit/credit/ATM card(s) you need
 - If bringing multiple cards, store them in separate places so you still have one if the other is stolen/lost
- TSA approved luggage locks
- Avoid public WiFi
- Don't let anybody – ESPECIALLY strangers into your room
 - If they say they are hotel employees, we can check with the front desk to make sure they sent them.
- Get in the habit of putting your hand on your belongings whenever anyone is in your personal space.
- Don't wear flashy jewelry or expensive clothing.



- If you must bring anything of any intrinsic or sentimental value, never let it leave your side.
- stay tethered to your bag, in any case NEVER allow yourself to be by yourself, or in a group of less than 3
- Don't do stupid things for photos
- Use ATMs wisely
 - Cover your hand when entering PIN
 - Look over your shoulder before beginning
 - If ATM has appeared to "eat your card" run your finger along the slot. There is a trick that thieves use where a thin plastic sleeve is captures your card - preventing ATM from reading it - and which is easily yanked out once you leave.
